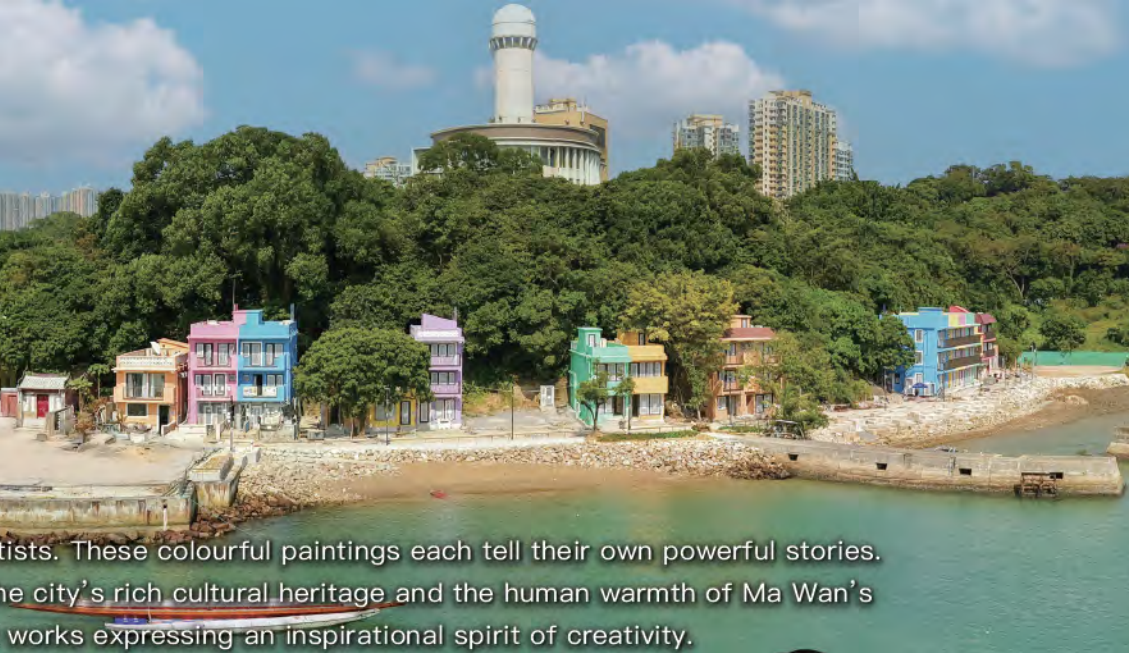


Art

Ma Wan Park: A Comprehensive Tourism and Cultural Destination

Ma Wan Park is a non-profit community facility. Developed in two phases, it is now a comprehensive tourism and cultural destination covering an area of 1.6 million square feet, combining the perfect experience of nature, education, conservation, cultural creativity, tourism and art retail. The first phase of the development brought together many popular attractions, including Hong Kong Noah's Ark, a theme park built in a 1:1 scale of Noah's Ark, and its connected Noah's Ark Resort Hotel. Other first-phase highlights include the Nature Park, a green park with themes combining nature, education, art and love, the Solar Pavilion featuring one of the largest civilian vacuum solar telescopes in Southeast Asia with a diameter of 350 mm, and the popular Solar Village resort located in lush natural scenery. The second phase of the project is Ma Wan 1868, which conserves, restores and renovates village houses into a cultural and arts hub. By providing a variety of cultural and creative studios, workshops, art retail stores and restaurants, it offers a vibrant platform for creativity and cultural exchange between local residents and tourists. Each project within Ma Wan 1868 has its own unique characteristics and role, adding to its rich diversity and interest value.

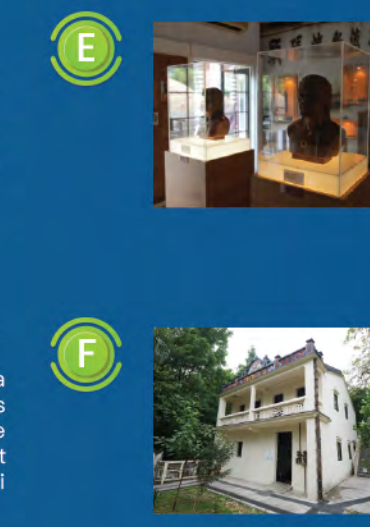


Tin Hau Temple
Ma Wan's Tin Hau Temple was built sometime before 1860 and was listed as a Grade III Historic Building in 2010. Ma Wan was one of the customs offices established in Hong Kong in the 1860s and 1870s. It fell into disrepair after being closed in 1898. The stone tablet records the disputes and agreements during the construction of the customs post.



"Mui Wai" Rock Inscription
The Antiquities and Monuments Office has designated this place as a "Site of Archaeological Research Interest". There is a mysterious stone carving of "Mui Wai" near the Kowloon Customs Stele, but the date of this carving is unknown. According to legend, Mui Wai was the base where Emperor Shao of Song ascended the throne, but in fact it was part of the Panyu fiefdom of Mui Wo.

Kowloon Customs Commemorative Tablets
Built between 1887 and 1899, these tablets are listed as a "Government Heritage Site" by the Antiquities and Monuments Office. The "Kowloon Gate" boundary marker of the old village of Ma Wan has disappeared. Its function was the same as that of the stone tablets. The village was once the Kap Shui Mun Gate Factory managed by foreigners.



Heritage Centre in Ma Wan Park (Junior Fong)
The Museum of Antiquities, which was revitalised from the Fong Yuen Study Hall (Junior Fong Yuen) established in 1956, is located within Ma Wan Park. Its exhibits are from the "Top Ten Archaeological Discoveries in China in 1997", including replica statues from the Neolithic Age and recreated Tang Dynasty lime kilns and Qing Dynasty brick kilns, all of which have precious historical value.

Fong Yuen Study Hall
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
